

# Fairfield Reserve



## Fairfield Heritage Woodland

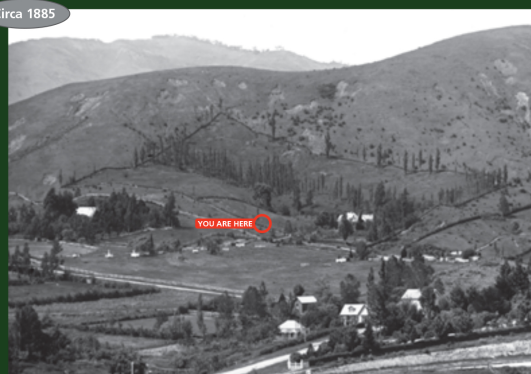
The gently graded woodland track through the Fairfield Reserve takes in many outstanding exotic trees, mostly planted during the 1850s and 1880s. Notable among these are seven Coast redwoods *Sequoia sempervirens*, the largest over 50m tall with a 6m girth. Also of note are several Himalayan cedars *Cedrus deodara*, Lawson's cypress *Cupressus lawsoniana*, Larch *Larix decidua*, Douglas fir *Pseudotsuga menziesii*, Oak *Quercus spp.* and an impressive Bunya Bunya *Araucaria bidwillii*.

Beside Fairfield House stands a magnificent Magnolia *Magnolia grandiflora*. A graceful Tulip tree *Liriodendron tulipifera*, one of the largest in the region, dominates the front lawn. Large elms are visible marking the boundaries.

Fairfield House and Reserve is administered by Friends of Old Fairfield Inc., on behalf of the Department of Conservation.
